# Are you Flood Ready?

## Make and use an emergency plan

Talk with members of your household about what to do during a disaster. Plan how you would leave your home in the event of flooding. Set a meeting spot in case you are separated. Include those with special needs and pets.



### Put your 3-day emergency kit together

Make an emergency kit with tools and supplies, non-perishable food and water. Visit <u>ready.gov/kit</u> for more details.



### Download disaster notification apps

Sign up for Monterey County's alert and warning system, Alert Monterey County.



# Know your flood risk

Living near creeks and rivers creates risk but there are many other dangers. Stay informed of emergency situations through emergency notifications, county/city websites and social media, television, radio and newspapers.



# Protect your home from flood threats

Sand and sandbags are available for Monterey County residents in locations around the county. <u>County of Monterey Public Works Sand Stockpiles</u>. Additional locations at Pajaro Park and Lewis/Salinas Roads

# Keep debris and trash out of our streams

Report blockages like wood or debris to the Monterey County Water Resources after hours line at 831-796-1166.
